Process/ Parameters:

A) Research the work of Wassily Kandinsky and aesthetic theory. Complete all art journal assignments and participate in media labs.

B) Create a design that will be repeated 4 times.

Your Final Design:

- 1. Create an abstract design which utilizes rhythm and repetition across the composition. Consider the mood/ expression of the design.
- 2. Include repeating lines **AND use** at least 12 shapes.
- 3. Crop some shapes on all 4 sides of the composition.

C) Trace your design onto tracing paper. Trace 3 lightly onto White drawing paper and 1 onto watercolor paper.

D) Create a plan for completing the four drawings/ paintings with the media listed below. For each one, you **must use transitions in color and/ or value**.

- 1. Sharpies, ink (black and/or color, and color pencil
- 2. Tempera
- 3. Watercolor
- 4. Mixed Media: Tempera or Watercolor with ink and color pencil

E) Create a plan for using color schemes.

- 1. Monochromatic positive shapes with Complementary negative space
- 2. Analogous colors
- 3. Split Complement
- 4. Free Choice- but please consider color relationships
- F) Mount your four finished paintings onto black paper very neatly.
